- * Steelpans were first made from old oil drums that were thrown away.
- * The steelpan is the only acoustic musical instrument invented in the 20th century!
- * Different types of steelpans play different notes - some play high notes and others play low notes.
- * A group of steelpan players is called a "steel orchestra" or "pan band."
- * Steelpans are played at Trinidad's famous Carnival celebration.


